“There has been a decrease in the

quantity of blood in the region, and we thought we could contribute something. Blood is an essential component of life, and without it, one cannot survive. This drive aims to save as many lives as possible through blood donations,” he said.

The Guild Vice President, Ndagire Hafswa Mbuga, stated that blood donation drives would continue throughout the year and be extended to the community, allowing others, besides students, to participate in saving lives. She mentioned that these community drives would commence this month in the neighborhoods surrounding the University.
